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This show is essentially made up of patterns on the sand below the surface of water, created by light projecting through it. The paintings are a response to light and the movement of water.

The exhibition's title 'In the Silence' refers to stillness where silence is an experience, not the absence of sound. For me, a painting is not necessarily about representing something, but the response within the mind and the emotions felt. A viewer's response is what the paintings are essentially about.

My work involves making stand-alone objects of contemplation. What engages me is the looking and the experience born out of a prolonged stare. It is about mystery and unknowing.

Having chosen an image for a painting, I involve myself in small areas only, not being concerned about the entire canvas. I paint with the canvas rotated on its side or upside down. This allows me to be removed from the final outcome and concentrated on the process of applying paint. Colours and tones and their relationship, one to another elicit different emotional responses. The completed painting, when it is turned the right way up is usually quite resolved, needing only minimal alteration to be considered finished.
